Ms. Jennifer Jakubowski has engaged professionally with Japanese-American relations for more than 15 years. Her initial professional experience was with The JET Program, a diplomatic initiative co-sponsored by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Council for Local and International Affairs, and the Ministry of Education. This was followed by employment with the Nagano Winter Olympic Committee as a cultural liaison and radio broadcaster. These engagements, coupled with her academic background, paved the road for a career advising some of the biggest names in business on bridging cultural differences between Japan and the U.S.

In her former capacity as Director of Consulting and Training Services for a New York-based consulting firm specializing in Japanese-American workplace relations, she oversaw the consulting division and spearheaded

the firm's training programs, training dozens of senior executives and diplomats on a host of cross-cultural issues. In the years since, she has laid the foundation for Bridges to Japan.

Ms. Jakubowski's Japan expertise has deep academic roots as well. She holds a BA in International Relations and an MA in International Studies & Diplomacy, both with a focus on Japanese studies.
